

Requirement: Establish Authorized Trading Partners

With so many touchpoints across the pharmaceutical supply chain it is essential to confirm that only trusted entities are involved in the exchange of prescription drugs. “Bad actors” can infiltrate the supply chain with counterfeit and/or diverted product, so it is essential that electronic systems are in place to verify the identity of each entity by being registered as Authorized Trading Partners (ATP).

The DSCSA 2023 regulation states that ATPs may only transact with other ATPs. This affects manufacturers, distributors, dispensers, repackagers, 3PLs and their trading partners.

Implementation of credentialing through authorized trading partners will also be key to product tracing under the DSCSA for 2023.



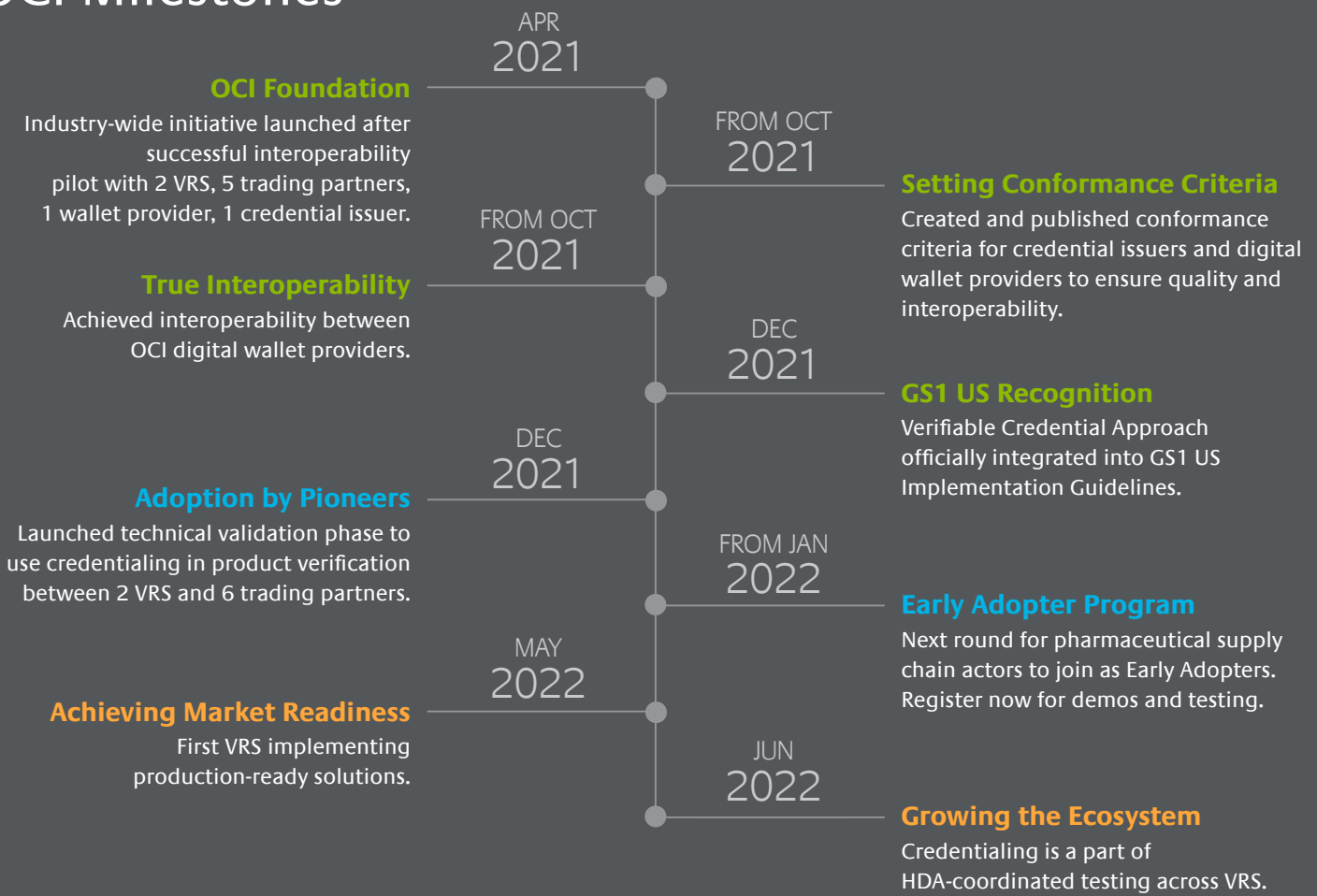
OCI Ecosystem
